ADVISER REFLECTION

Thank you Talako for another resilient year in the face of Covid; flexible in the face of ever-changing routines while remaining creative and positive during our quest to deliver cheerful service in 2021.

We were able to transition from an almost exclusively Zoom form of Arrowman Scouting in 2020 and early 2021 into a safe and masked in-person version late spring this year. We held a mobile Pinewood Derby Workshop at the Elks Club in February for almost 80 Cub Scouts. We were able to hold 2 inperson Inductions, assist Council with Summer Camp at Marin Sierra and Cub Camp at Tamarancho, as well as serving at Family Fiesta in the Fall. In just the past 3 months we co-managed a 10 Lodge 400+ person Area-Clave on Coast Guard Island, Alameda, and were able to hold Unit elections and host our second Induction with 15 new members. Then we collected 35,500 pounds of food for the SF/Marin Food Bank and sent 13 members to NLS/DYLC in Saratoga. On November 28th another 20+ Arrowmen helped to extensively decorate our host's facility, the Elks Lodge in San Rafael, for the coming holidays.

Your Chief Alex Perry, Associate Adviser Willy Coronado and myself also attended the National Council of Chiefs, a week long seminar at the Philmont Training Center in Cimmaron, NM in August. At this event we were privy to and Alex was asked to vote on many changes to the Order of the Arrow which we should all see implemented in the next few months as we prepare to convene at the National Order of the Arrow Conference at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville in late July 2022; the first NOAC in 4 years as well as the first NOAC in Tennessee during my tenure as Lodge Adviser. NOAC will be an amazing opportunity for any and all Talako Arrowmen and you will hear more over the next few months as we prepare to make our journey out to this tremendously exciting and rewarding event next summer.

In closing I am so proud of our LEC, our Advisers and Marin Council for managing and providing as complete a program as admissible to all of our Lodge Members. I am also indebted to our Lodge members who rise up and tirelessly serve our local community with heart and soul. Finally, I am exceptionally excited by the addition of so many inspiring and invigorated new Lodge members both youth and adult, male and female. This is the new face of Scouting and the OA.
